## **NEED ASSISTANCE WITH MEDICAL DIRECTIVES AND FORMS?**

WILL YOU BE PREPARED IF YOU ARE IN AN ACCIDENT OR WORSE? WHAT ABOUT A STROKE OR EMERGENCY SURGERY AND YOU CAN NOT VOICE YOUR OPINION ON MEDICAL NEEDS?

If you need medical directive forms or need help filling them out, Rev. David Farmer is the one to see. While no legal advice will be offered, he will guide you through the process itself. We have Advance Directive, Medical Power of Attorney, Durable Financial Power of Attorney as well as DNR forms. Rev. David will be happy to walk you through filling them out and providing witnesses. Debra in the office is a Notary Public in the state of Texas and can notarize your signatures. Of course, most banks have Notaries also. Don't wait so late that someone else has to make these critical decisions for you.

### Be Deliberate in Planning

The Apostle Paul, in his second letter to the church at Corinth, writes: So I thought it necessary to urge the brothers to go on ahead to you, and arrange in advance for this bountiful gift that you have promised, so that it may be ready as a voluntary gift and not as an extortion (2 Corinthians 9:5).

Paul indicates it is not enough to intend to be a good steward. You must plan, and it is by carefully making provisions for a planned gift and implementation of that plan that you will be able to enjoy the fruits of Christian stewardship!

Paul admonishes us to be deliberate in considering the mission and ministry of the church for which the gift will be used In the case of the Corinthians, Paul reminds them of the great purpose: to alleviate the poverty of the Jerusalem Christians and to help preserve the unity of the church.

Planning to include our church in your will involves more than just contacting an attorney and drafting a will. Making a bequest to our church involves thoughtful discussion with your family: spouse, children, perhaps siblings, and others with whom you have an important relationship and those who have a relationship to your estate.

Ultimately, making the right decision will allow you, the giver, to find greater joy and fulfillment in the process and completion of the gift.

## 8 Important Reasons to Have a Will

Seven out of 10 of us DO NOT have a will!! What are we thinking? No will? Do we not care what happens to those assets we will leave behind?

Did you know:

- 1. Without a will, your state's laws-not you-determine how, when and to whom your property is distributed?
- 2. You can reduce (or perhaps even eliminate) estate taxes and save taxes in a survivor's estate?
- 3. You can name your executor to manage and settle your estate?
- 4. You can designate beneficiaries for items such as heirlooms, art objects, jewelry, or real estate?
- 5. You may create trusts to provide for your spouse, children, and others?
- 6. Through a pour-over will, you can transfer leftover assets to your living trust, bypassing probate?
- 7. You can be a blessing to First Christian Church through a bequest, which is simple, flexible and tax deductible?
- 8. With a will, you can designate the guardian you wish for those under your care?

By including the church in your estate plan, there will be a little child in the future that will laugh out loud at the wonderful good news that God is love; a teenager one day on Spring break in Mexico that will see that love first hand; a struggling adult that will finally understand what grace means in so complex and difficult a world--because of you.

#### A Will Lets You...

- Designate who will act as executor of your estate in probate.
- Specify which items of property will go to specific individuals.
- Name of the guardians of minor children in case of the death of you and your spouse.
- Leave property and a gift to the church: This can be a tremendous faith statement to your heirs, and a wonderful way to bless the ongoing ministry of our church.
